Study Circle Reporting.....


The 46th Study Circle of Universal Briefing took place on 20th September, 2025 at 7.30 pm. The speaker for the session was Dr. Nivedita Bhattacharyya Sahu, Associate Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Vidyasagar University and the President of the session was Dr. Arabinda Maity, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Calcutta, West Bengal. The topic of the study circle was "Reading Habits in the age of Artificial Intelligence".

The speaker delivered a thought-provoking talk on a topic highly relevant in today's Al-driven era. She traced how reading practices have shifted over time, particularly in the 21st century, highlighting the impact of digital technologies on how people engage with written content, especially in the context of our country. She emphasized the many benefits of strong reading habits. Dr. Bhattacharyya Sahu also explored how the publishing industry has undergone significant changes in a "cash-rich, time-poor" economy. Drawing from the 2024 World Population Review, she shared global reading trends, noting that India ranks second only to the USA in both the number of books read per year and time spent reading. However, she also raised an important concern: a steady decline in children's enjoyment of reading, as reported by the National Literacy Trust. This led her to pose a critical question if libraries are still necessary in an age where information is instantly accessible at our fingertips. The speaker concluded by reaffirming the enduring relevance of libraries and outlined how they can continue to nurture a culture of reading in an increasingly digital and Al-driven world.






administrators, policy makers and government.





Students Corner

UGC-NET - Junior Research Fellowship

UGC-NET is a test to determine the eligibility of Indian nationals for 'award of Junior Research Fellowship and appointment as Assistant Professor', 'appointment as Assistant Professor and admission to Ph.D.' and 'admission to Ph.D. only' in Indian universities and colleges. Any candidate aiming to qualify UCC NET must have a master's degree or equivalent in a relevant subject from a recognized university (55% aggregate marks for General/EWS/OBC candidates and 50% for SC/ST/OBC/PwD/Transgender candidates). The age limit is up to 30 years for the general category. Age relaxation for candidates in OBC-NCL, SC/ST, PwD, and women categories is applicable as per government rules. JRF qualified candidates can get admission into the Ph.D. programme in their post-graduation subjects or allied areas in universities/institutions recognized by the University Grants Commission (UGC) as per the regulations.

UGC-Junior Research Fellowship (JRF): Candidates must secure the minimum qualifying marks for the Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) in the UGC-NET examination in their respective subjects to become eligible for the fellowship. The total number of slots available for awarding JRF is allocated among different categories as per the reservation policy of the government.

National Fellowship for Other Backward Classes (NF-OBC): This fellowship is granted to unemployed students belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC) to pursue Ph.D. degrees (full-time) in Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences and Engineering & Technology. OBC students who have qualified for the National Eligibility Test- Junior Research Fellowship (NET-JRF) of UGC or UGC-Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (UGC-CSIR) NET-JRF joint test are eligible to apply for the fellowship. New slots are declared every year, and selection is merit-based.

National Fellowship for Scheduled Caste Students (NFSC): This fellowship is provided to Scheduled Caste (SC) students for pursuing Ph.D. degree in Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences in Indian Universities/Institutions/Colleges recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC). The scheme provides new slots every year to such SC students who have qualified the National Eligibility Test- Junior Research Fellowship (NET-JRF) of UGC or UGC-Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (UGC-CSIR) NET-JRF joint test. These slots are over and above the number of SC students selected under the normal reservation policy of the Government for UGC Junior Research Fellowship.

For all the above fellowships:

- The cutoff for qualifying for the fellowship is determined every year as per the rules for each subjects separately.
- The candidates are entitled to a Monthly Stipend to conduct research along with Housing Rent Allowance (HRA) and Contingency Grant.
- Initially the JRF is granted for two years. After two years of joining JRF, if the progress in the
 research work of the awardee is found satisfactory, his/her tenure is extended for a further period
 of three years as Senior Research Fellowship (SRF) as per UGC Fellowship Guidelines.

Library in Focus

The Story of 136-Year-Old Chaitanya Library: A Bibliophile's Paradise



Among the most significant institutions in Kolkata, century old Chaitanya Library is one such paradise. The library was inaugurated on 5th February, 1889 on the auspicious occasion of Basanti Panchami or Saraswati Puja (Hindu Goddess of Knowledge). This 136-year-old library was the brainchild of stalwarts of the late 19th century, boasting of Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore as one of its founding members. Other two founder members were Gaur Hari Sen and Kunj Behari Datta. After being established by Rabindranath Tagore and others on 5th Feb 1889, the library is credited with the distinction as the first registered society of its kind on 5th Aug 1891 under Societies Registration Act 1860 in undivided Bengal. Tagore was one of the signatories of the trust deed of 1891 and the poet was associated with the library as Vice President from 1890 to

several years thereafter. After that the Chaitanya Library was grew up by a committee of 284 members including 6 women.

Many great men of the past like Sir Asutosh Chowdhury, Dwijendranath Tagore, Rev. Alex Tomory, Sir Gurudas Banerjee, Dr Mahendralal Sarkar, Bankim Chandra Chattopdhyay, Sir Ramendra Sunder Trivedi, R. C. Dutta, Dr R. C. Bhandarkar, Sister Nivedita, Justice of Calcutta High Court, Consul Generals of USA delivered lectures and attended sessions here. The library bears another distinction of witnessing 2 Nobel laureates, Tagore and C.V. Raman deliver lectures only at this institution in the pre independence era. Sometimes, the numbers were so large that the Minerva Theatre next door was used to accommodate the audience. The library itself came to be esteemed as a storehouse of Bengali literature. Chaitanya Library was the witness of an interesting episode of Bengal literature. Bankimchandra Chattopadhyay died on 8th April, 1894. Three weeks after his death, a memorial meeting organized by the Chaitanya Library and the Beadon Square Literary Club was held at Star Theatre. It was decided that the speakers would be Rajanikanta Gupta, the famous historian; Haraprasad Sastri, notable scholar of Buddhism and Bengali literature and Rabindranath Tagore, then a young but already much acclaimed poet.

The library started its operation at 83, Beadon Street with two periodicals, Bangabasi and Sanjibani and the daily, Indian Mirror. Towards the end of 1893, it shifted to a two-storeyed building at 4/1, Beadon Street on a monthly rent of Rs.200 where it completed its 125th birth anniversary. The ground floor housed a free reading room and a lecture-cum-meeting place. Now the library houses over 150,000 documents including books, rare books and journals, other invaluable works on Indian history, philosophy and culture.

According to a library well-wisher, the books need immediate restoration and digitization is also a plan that is on the agenda for improvement. All these require a huge sum of money but unfortunately the library is neither aided by the Government nor by any private donors. The subscription system is long out of date and amounts to a paltry INR 5 per month per member. The committee which presently runs the library wishes to send its message of request of help to the larger community out in the city to come forward with their help and resources to give the library a fresh lease of life.

The library is the venue for free classes for the children of the nearby slums. Along with such endeavours, the library also seeks to re-establish itself as a hub of cultural activities in North Kolkata. A senior committee member said that "it is our shared responsibility to do whatever we can in our own way to protect this story and take it forward for the next generation". Today, the library stands as a monumental institution, housing untold quantities of rare books on Indian history, politics, and culture. Good news is that The Calcutta Heritage Collective has taken up the project to restore and revive the heritage library.
