Announcement

39th Study Circle

The 39th study circle of universal briefing took place on 1st March at 7.30 pm. The speaker for the session was Niladri Majumdar, Junior Research Fellow, Department of Library and Information Science, Jadavpur University, Kolkata, West Bengal and the President of the session was Dr. Soumen Mondal, Librarian, Prasanta Chandra Mahalanobis Mahavidyalaya, Kolkata, West Bengal. The topic of the study circle was "Diversity among authors and editors representing LIS literature".

The speaker presented a detailed analysis of a study he conducted on bibliographic records from the LIS domain, sourced from the OPAC of Jadavpur University. He began by defining the concept of diversity and then explored it from a sociocultural perspective. The study focused on assessing the representation in LIS literature, examining factors such as gender, ethnicity, and institutional affiliation. The main objective of his research was to evaluate the inclusivity of LIS literature and identify potential gaps in diverse representation within the collection under study. To achieve this, Mr. Majumdar employed a random sampling technique for selecting his study sample. Through his findings, he revealed that, among the five continents, authors from Asia were the most frequently represented. However, female representation in the literature was notably low, except in North America. In India, the gender gap was particularly striking, with female representation being only about one-fifth of that of their male counterparts, which underscores the pressing need to address gender disparities in research and academic recognition, advocating for a more equitable and inclusive culture within academia.

libraries and publish them in one volume.



<u>DeepSeek</u> is the name of a free Al-powered chatbot, which looks, feels and works very much like ChatGPT. DeepSeek, a Chinese artificial intelligence (Al) startup, made headlines worldwide after it topped app download charts and caused US tech stocks to sink.

In January 2025, it released its latest model, DeepSeek R1, which it said rivalled technology developed by ChatGPT-maker OpenAl in its capabilities, while costing far less to create.

Key Features of DeepSeek Al

Open-Source Technology

DeepSeek stands out with open-source technology. Its AI models, like the new releases DeepSeek-V3 and DeepSeek-R1, are made open-source, so their source code can be accessed for free by developers and researchers to share ideas and make improvements within the AI community. Open-source models can create faster breakthroughs through users contributing improvement and adaptations.

Cost Efficiency

The strategy for DeepSeek development puts focus on cost-effectiveness. The company argues that it built the models at one-tenth the price that the competing giant OpenAl took. While it is reportedly true that OpenAl invested billions to build the model, DeepSeek only managed to produce the newest model with approximately \$5.6 million. This puts forth the issue of price sustainability in Al and showcases the new firms which might change the entire scenario in comparison with a high-price model due to low-priced strategies.

Market Impact and Reactions

The rise of DeepSeek has made a huge impact on the technology sector and has evoked significant stock market reactions. In fact, for instance, Nvidia shares plummeted as DeepSeek gained popularity. This reaction illustrates broader concerns about the dominance of American companies in the field of Al and how competition from Chinese companies is likely to shift the dynamics in the market.
