Study Circle Reporting.....

43rd Study Circle_The 43rd study circle of Universal Briefing took place on 28th June, 2025. The speaker for the session was Dr. Shantashree Basu, Guest faculty, Department of Library & Information Science, Rabindra Bharati University. The President of the session was Dr. Ranjan Samanta, Librarian, Naba Ballygunge Mahavidyalaya, Kolkata, West Bengal. The topic of the study circle was "Interdisciplinary Subjects: Tracing Their Evolving Representation in Library Classification".


The speaker delivered an engaging presentation on a very compelling topic within the field of library and information science. She began by clearly defining the concept of interdisciplinary subjects and articulating the reasons for their emergence. This was followed by a thoughtful discussion on the importance of examining how such subjects are represented within library classification schemes. She then outlined the processes underlying the development and formation of interdisciplinary subjects, offering a detailed case study of a specific interdisciplinary domain. Tracing its historical evolution over the past 500–600 years, Dr. Basu illustrated the stages of its development, the typology of relationships involved, and the changing modes of its formation. She also highlighted how its classification within the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) system has shifted over time. She concluded the presentation with the insightful observation, drawn from her research, that classificatory structures indeed reflect the historical development and evolution of interdisciplinary subjects.






Obituary

Bhagawan Chandra Sarmah (1942–2025)

Veteran Librarian, Visionary Educationist, and Stalwart of Assam's Library Movement



Renowned library science expert and respected academic Bhagawan Chandra Sarmah, former Director of Library Education, Government of Assam, passed away on May 19, 2025, at a private hospital in Tezpur. He was 84. His passing has left a deep void in Assam's academic and library communities. Born in 1942 in Nalbari, Sarmah began his distinguished career as District Librarian in Silchar, where he promoted reading culture and community engagement with libraries. His commitment to expanding access to information saw him later serve in Lakhimpur and Tezpur, before rising to the post of Director of Library Education in Guwahati. He opted for voluntary retirement in 2000 but remained active in academic and social life. A long-time resident of Kundil Nagar, Tezpur, Sarmah played a key role in Assam's

Library Movement. Known for his integrity, leadership, and passion for learning, he worked tirelessly to promote equitable access to library resources. Even post-retirement, he mentored young professionals, contributed to cultural forums, and continued to advocate for the transformative power of libraries.

On May 16, Sarmah suffered a fall at home, resulting in a serious head injury. He was admitted to hospital but succumbed three days later. Despite recent health challenges, he remained intellectually engaged until the end. Sarmah's public-spirited legacy extended beyond libraries. With financial support from his younger daughter Bhaswati Sarmah (Canada-based), and with help from then District Commissioner Deba Kumar Mishra, he helped establish a 500 LPM oxygen generation plant at Tezpur Kanaklata Civil Hospital. The facility was inaugurated in his presence by Minister Chandra Mohan Patowary on August 16, 2023. He is survived by his daughters Urvashi and Bhaswati Sarmah, two sons-in-law, two granddaughters, and many admirers. His death has been widely mourned by leaders including Tezpur MLA Prithiraj Rava, former Education Minister Brindaban Goswami, and cultural bodies like Tezpur Xahitya Xabha, Baan Theatre, and the Tezpur District Library. Bhagawan Chandra Sarmah's life was a testament to service, scholarship, and social commitment. His contributions will be remembered for generations to come. May his soul rest in eternal peace.

Under Gyan Post, printed materials that are "prescribed in the syllabus for correspondence and regular courses for students" by State and Union government education boards or universities will be permitted to be carried through Gyan Post; periodicals like magazines will not be covered under the scheme. Anna Al Club Launched at Anna Centenary Library. The Anna Centenary Library in Chennai has launched the Anna Al Club to promote Al awareness and creativity. The club will host discussions with experts and enthusiasts. It aims to influence policy and bridge Al with education, heritage, and technology. Bhubaneswar Airport (Biju Patnaik International Airport) has a Flybrary—India's first "Take-a-Book" airport library—run by the Bakul Foundation in partnership with AAI. There are two unmanned book shelves, one each at the Departures and Arrivals areas. You can browse and pick any book (fiction, self-help, magazines, children's titles) in English, Hindi, or Odia from a collection of about 600 books. Take it home if you like, read at your leisure, and later return it at any Flybrary rack when you travel next—or mail it back to the Bakul Foundation. A volunteer restocks and organizes the shelves daily, though restocking remains a challenge due to high demand.

The state School Education department has sanctioned Rs 20.26 crore for the procurement of library books in 2,026 government-aided and sponsored schools across West Bengal. According to an official notification issued by the Commissioner of School Education, each school has received a grant of Rs 1 lakh for the 2024-25 financial year. The funds will be used to purchase curated sets

of books, tailored to the specific requirements of each district. As per the directive, the department has divided the state's 25 education districts into five groups, with each group assigned a distinct set of books (each set contains around 500 to 600 titles) valued at approximately Rs 1 lakh.

Union Home Minister Amit Shah visited the INFLIBNET Centre which is an autonomous UGC body and called for expanding its digital services to benefit more students and academic libraries nationwide. He **launched** the "Sastu Sahitya Vardhak Karyalay" mobile app and emphasized that "every book finds a reader, and every reader finds a book". He also endorsed a model e-public library project, reinforcing the government's push towards digitization.

Jai Prakash Narayan (JPN) Library, New Delhi has been scheduled to open by **September 2025**, with current work on IT infrastructure, digital access, and disability-friendly facilities in advanced stages. The expansion brings NDMC's public library network total to nine, with a state-of-the-art digital library component planned. For more details <u>click here</u>

The Deep End of Climate Crisis: A Cultural Heritage Perspective



On June 19, 2025, UNESCO Headquarters in Paris hosted an international scientific meeting titled "Underwater cultural heritage and the challenges of climate change." In collaboration with Drassm (French Ministry of Culture), a Scientific Conference was held on June 19, 2025, to commemorate the 10th session of the Meeting of the States Parties and the 16th Meeting of the Scientific and Technical Advisory Body of the 2001 Convention on the Protection of the Underwater Cultural Heritage.

The goal of the conference was to provide a vibrant forum where attendees could actively discuss issues, exchange

best practices, and explore cutting-edge approaches to safeguarding undersea cultural treasures. This year's talks addressed "Underwater cultural heritage and the challenges of climate change." The public, media, accredited NGOs, university partner networks, specialists, representatives of States Parties to the Convention, and Observers Member States were all welcome to attend the scientific meeting.

The conference was a key part of a worldwide effort to connect climate issues to culture. This effort included events like the "UNESCO Reflection Meeting on Culture and Climate Action: Towards MONDIACULT 2025 and COP30" (March 2025), the United Nations Ocean Conference (UNOC3, June 2025), and planned projects like the "International Conference on Climate Action at the Intersection of Water, Culture, and Heritage in the Indian Ocean and Red Sea Region" that UNESCO will soon host.

Climate change and anthropogenic activities are putting substantial strain on the undersea cultural heritage. However, there is currently a lack of preparedness for managing these stresses. This scientific conference aimed to increase awareness of the effects of climate change on coastal and underwater cultural heritage, foster dialogue among experts, decision-makers, heritage professionals, archaeologists, and the general public, and promote interdisciplinary collaboration and international cooperation. On this occasion, over twenty specialists from around the world were invited to talk in four sessions on understanding risks, inventory and documentation, safeguarding and adaption challenges, and synergies and multidisciplinary approaches to emergency response. It was organized into four thematic sessions:

- Understanding the Threats: Examining the impact of increasing sea levels, extreme weather events, and environmental change on coastal and undersea cultural assets.
- Inventory and documentation: Introducing methods for inventorying, documenting, and mapping heritage assets vulnerable by climate change.
- Loss or preservation through adaptation? Developing adaptable solutions and resilience-building efforts for heritage preservation.
- Synergies and interdisciplinary: Demonstrating how cross-sector collaboration can improve heritage protection.

Several libraries in West Bengal played a significant role in the Indian freedom movement by fostering nationalist sentiment and providing spaces for discussion and debate. The Bandhab Library, Joynagar, established in 1869, was a key center for intellectual and political discourse during that period. It was established by Shri Golokenath Mukhopadhyaya at Joynagar Majilpur, South 24 Parganas, W.B. It was formerly known as the Joynagar Free Reading Club and was renamed the Bandhab Library in 1942.

For more than 157 years, this library has been serving the people of Joynagar Majilpur and surrounding areas of South 24 Parganas through its historical collections. According to librarian Smt. Madhumita Bandopadhyaya, this library is mine of information on regional history. It has various books and published documents on the Sundarbans. She also said that it is true that there is some disruption in services due to lack of Govt. funds. Former library-in-charge Mr. Bijan Ghosh said, "This library has a lot of information related to the folk culture of the Sundarbans. This library is also a repository of information related to folk music."
