The 47th Study Circle The 47th study circle of Universal Briefing took place on 1st November, 2025 at 7.30 pm. The speaker for the session was Dr Pubalika Bhattacharya Maitra, Associate Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, University of Calcutta and the President of the session was Dr Subarna Kumar Das, Professor, Department of Library and Information Science, Jadavpur University, West Bengal. The topic of the study circle was "Indigenous Health Information Dissemination: Perspectives and Practices".

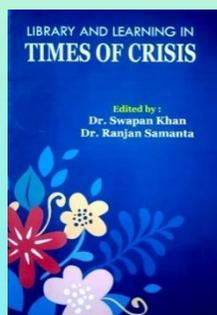
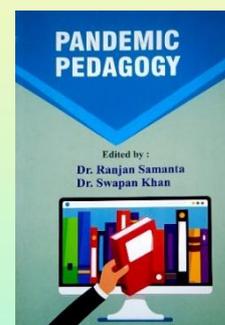
The speaker's deliberation drew attention to a subject of significant importance. She commenced her talk with a narrative from the Vedic age, underscoring the profound wisdom and intellectual heritage of our ancestors. Building on this foundation, she elaborated on the concept of Indigenous Knowledge Systems (IKS), explaining their defining characteristics, applications, and relevance in contemporary contexts. The speaker also cited UNESCO's views on indigenous knowledge, placing the discussion in a global context. Subsequently, she explored the domain of indigenous health information, highlighting various governmental initiatives undertaken in India to promote IKS, particularly within the healthcare sector. She outlined the processes involved in the dissemination of indigenous health information and examined both national and international best practices in this field, with special focus on AYUSH. Dr. Maitra also emphasized the vital role of LIS professionals in bridging traditional and modern knowledge systems. She concluded her talk by stating that Indigenous Knowledge is not something new to be instilled, but an inherent part of our heritage that we are seeking to rediscover and revive. digital and AI-driven world.

Our Publication.....

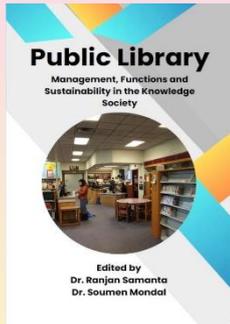
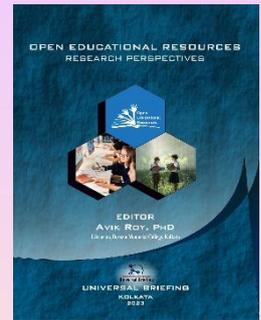

Students Corner

Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship (SVMCM)

The **Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship (SVMCM)** is a scholarship scheme provided by the Government of West Bengal to economically backward students. It is designed to provide financial support to those who aim to pursue higher education but belong to economically weaker sections. Undergraduate, Postgraduate, as well as Doctoral level programs of various streams/subjects are covered under the scholarship. Any regular students enrolled in government or government-aided universities, colleges, and institutions within West Bengal and below the specified economic level are eligible to apply for the scholarship. The Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, administers the SVMCM scheme.

Eligibility Criteria

1. Academic Qualification

- *For Undergraduate Scholarship:* Students studying at undergraduate level in Science/Arts/Commerce/Engineering or Medical courses are eligible to apply. Also, a student pursuing Technical or Professional courses may apply for the same. Any candidate applying for

the scholarship must have passed the Higher Secondary or equivalent examination with the required minimum marks specified by the scheme for that academic year.

- *For Post Graduate Scholarship:* Post Graduate level students pursuing Science/Arts/Commerce & Technical/Management are eligible for the scholarship. Candidates applying must have completed their undergraduate degree and secured the minimum prescribed percentage in graduation specified by the scheme for that academic year.
- *For Ph.D. Degree Scholarship:* Non-NET registered full-time research scholars or NET-Assistant Professor/PhD only candidates of any recognized institutions of West Bengal may apply for the scholarship. The registration of Ph. D must not be before 01.04.2017.

2. Income Criteria

- The annual family income must not exceed the limit notified by the government which as of now is Rs. 2.5 lakh per annum.

3. Institutional Requirement

- Students must be enrolled in regular, full-time courses in government or government-aided universities, colleges, and institutions within West Bengal.

4. Residency Requirement

- The applicant must be a permanent resident of West Bengal.

Students must not be recipients of any other government scholarship at the time of application.

Benefits Provided

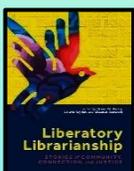
Scholarship amount offered under SVMCM Scholarship depends on the stream and level of course the students are enrolled in. The scholarship amount offered ranges from ₹1,000 to ₹8,000 per month. For Ph.D. Scholars the scholarship amount is Rs. 8000 per month as fixed by the Higher Education Department. Students of Library and Information Science domain can avail the benefits of the scheme if they fulfil the basic dual eligibility criteria of academic merit and economic need.

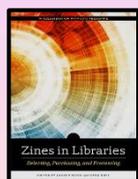
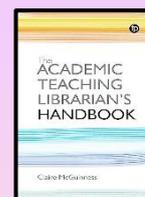

Chat 'GPT Go' free for all Indian Users:

In a major push to consolidate its presence in the Indian market, OpenAI has announced that it will offer ChatGPT Go free to all users in India starting November 4. For the uninitiated, ChatGPT Go is OpenAI's mid-tier subscription plan for its AI chatbot ChatGPT. The move targets India, which the company identifies as its second-largest and fastest-growing global market. The year-long complimentary access to ChatGPT Go comes as a direct response to similar aggressive user acquisition tactics by rivals Google and Perplexity. Both companies recently waived fees for their premium AI features to appeal to the vast Indian consumer base. OpenAI's decision follows Google's move to make its AI Pro membership, priced at Rs 19,500\$, free for students for a year. Similarly, Perplexity partnered with telecom giant Airtel to offer free access to its premium plan, intensifying the battle for AI market share in the country. For more information click [HERE](#).

Grokpedia:

It is an AI-generated online encyclopedia developed by xAI (the artificial-intelligence company founded by Elon Musk). It was officially launched on October 27, 2025 (version 0.1) with around 800,000+ articles at launch. Musk positioned it as a competitor to Wikimedia Foundation's Wikipedia, saying it would be a "massive improvement" over Wikipedia. The name Grokpedia is derived from the company's chatbot "Grok"

How it works (or purportedly works):

According to announcements: the site will use the AI model Grok to analyze existing sources (including Wikipedia), determine what's true, what's partially true, what's false or missing, and generate entries accordingly ([NDTV](#)).

Unlike Wikipedia's volunteer-edited wiki model, Grokpedia's editorial process is less transparent. Articles are generated by the AI, with users (as of now) able to suggest edits via a form, but not directly edit content themselves. ([WIKIPEDIA](#)).

Social Media News



Central Sanskrit University, the nodal agency for implementing union govt's Sanskrit related policies and schemes, has gifted six rare manuscripts to the Rashtrapati Bhawan Library. The collection includes **Valmiki Ramayan**, **Manushyalaya Chandrika** (on domestic architecture and Vastu Shastra), **Visha Vaidya** (Ayurvedic toxicology), **Ksemakutuhalam** (food science and dietetics), **Kavi Rahasyam** (poetic lexicon), and **Atri Smrti** (a Dharma text attributed to sage Atri). The manuscripts were handed over by vice-chancellor Prof. Srinivasa Varkhedi to the President of India's office. Officials said the gifting of the manuscripts aims to make rare Sanskrit works more accessible to scholars and researchers.

Panjab University's Department of Library & Information Science hosts Open Access Week (Oct 20-26). The PU department organised activities around the theme of open access, free knowledge and reducing barriers in digital/academic environments. A poster-making competition titled "Who Controls Our Knowledge?" that drew students and faculty into visualising issues of copyright, control and access to scholarly content. This reflects a growing trend in our domain to engage with open science, digital equity and social media-friendly campaigns in India.

Libraries open in three Resident Welfare Associations (RWAs) in Lucknow under "Gyan Kendras" initiative (Oct 13, 2025). In the Sarojininagar constituency, the local MLA inaugurated libraries in three RWAs (Himalaya Enclave, Kailash Enclave, Nilgiri Enclave) as part of a vision to convert 104 RWAs into centres of knowledge. It shows how library services are being extended into community spaces.

The October 2025 issue of the **International Federation of Library Associations and Institutions (IFLA) Newsletter** reflects on the theme of "**championing equality**" emphasising how libraries and information services play a vital role in advancing equitable access, inclusive communities, and social justice.

Across central & southern Illinois, a "**Library Crawl**" event during October 2025 invited patrons to visit multiple libraries, collect stamps on a passport, and share their experiences on social media under the hashtag **#IHLSLibraryCrawl2025**.



The **automatic book vending** machine installed at **Chennai Central Railway Station** has received an excellent response. According to Chennai Railway Division officials: To encourage reading habits among passengers, an automatic book vending machine was inaugurated near the passenger waiting area at Central Railway Station on 10th October. A curated collection of books — including novels, motivational titles, and children's literature — is being offered. The initiative has attracted a large number of visitors. Officials added that similar automatic book vending machines will be installed at other major railway stations in the coming months.

Unlocking the Past: A Hands-on Workshop on Archival Digitisation

The Ministry of Culture, Government of India, has officially launched a week-long Workshop on 'Digitisation and Conservation of Archival Collections', taking place from 13 to 17 October 2025 at Jamia Hamdard in New Delhi. This initiative, organized in collaboration with the Indira Gandhi National Centre for the Arts (IGNCA) and Jamia Hamdard University, aims to enhance skills and promote best practices in preserving India's rich archival heritage through the implementation of modern digitisation and conservation technologies.

The key themes are as follows:

1. Understanding heritage, culture, and the importance of safeguarding archival collections.
 2. Fundamentals and advanced techniques of digitization.
 3. Digital preservation and ethical considerations.
 4. Remedial conservation: cleaning, mending, and restoration of documents.
 5. Preventive conservation: environmental control, disaster risk management, and storage solutions.
- Practical sessions on digitization, metadata, image editing, and conservation methods.

The workshop commenced with an inaugural session attended by Shri Vivek Aggarwal, Secretary of the Ministry of Culture, and Dr. Sachchidanand Joshi, Member Secretary of IGNCA, under the leadership of Professor (Dr.) M. Afshar Alam, Vice-Chancellor of Jamia Hamdard. The dignitaries also took the opportunity to tour the University Archives, where they reviewed current digitisation projects and engaged with experts specializing in archival conservation. This initiative underscored the Ministry's ongoing dedication to protecting the nation's documentary legacy and fostering innovative practices in cultural preservation.

Library in Focus

The Alipore Zoo is set to open its Century old Library to the public for the first time in its history of 150 years

Alipore Zoological Garden is a notable institution located in South Kolkata. It is the oldest zoological garden in the country, established in 1875, and has transformed into one of the most attractive institutions for wildlife conservation and history education in India over the past 150 years.

In a landmark initiative, Kolkata's iconic Alipore Zoological Gardens is set to open its historic library to the public for the first time since its establishment 150 years ago. The library has until now remained accessible only to zoo officials and select personnel.

Library in Focus

A senior zoo official said, "It is home to many indigenous animals; such as tigers, lions, elephants. There are also exotic animals such as giraffes, zebras, chimpanzees, lemurs, etc., as well as various birds and reptiles. Where visitors get the opportunity to learn about and see these magnificent animals. Now they can learn more about them by reading the books in the library. Until now, this library was only used by senior officials of the zoo."

The library at Alipore is named after Sir Jyotindra Mohan Tagore who was one of the patrons of the zoo during its inception. He desired that the zoo should have a library with books related with animal healthcare. So, he donated a good amount of money which contributed to the setting up of the library in 1898. Sir John Edgar, another patron of the zoo had donated bookshelves for keeping books of the library.

The first superintendent of Alipore Zoo was Ram Brahma Sanyal. His extensive activities and writings can also be found in the library. Ram Brahma Sanyal was born in 1851 in Lalgola, Murshidabad district. Later he came in contact with Dr. John Anderson and Dr. George King. Under their influence, Ram Brahma Sanyal was appointed as a general worker in the Alipore Zoo. Through diligence and efficiency, he was promoted to the post of Executive Superintendent in April 1878. Subsequently, in April 1880, he was appointed as the first superintendent of the zoo. He observed and recorded daily the caged conditions of the animals in the zoo, their feeding habits, their behavior during breeding, and their treatment. Later, he was inspired to write a book titled 'A Handbook of the Management of Wild Animals in Captivity in Lower Bengal'. This type of book was the first written in the world and the book was published in 1892. Copies of that rare book can also be found in digital form in the library and on the zoo's website.

As part of a major heritage conservation project, over 1,400 rare books and documents — including handwritten letters by the zoo's first superintendent are being digitised. The digitised collection will be available at the physical library and on the official zoo website later this year.

The library also preserves significant documents from the West Bengal Forest Department and Alipore Zoo's administrative history: a rich archive now set to enter the public domain for the first time in over a century. Zoo official said that "We want them to be properly preserved so that the future generation can access them."
