There are more than 3,20,000 public libraries worldwide, 73 percent of them in developing and transitioning countries and more about 70,000 public libraries in India. Another estimation puts the figure at 1 lakh plus libraries in India which are at all levels - beginning at the state level, district level, block level, village level. Presently there are 2480 public libraries in West Bengal out of which, there are 13 Govt. Public Libraries, 2460 Govt. Sponsored Public Libraries and 7 Govt. Aided Public Libraries. It is very sad that many public libraries in West Bengal are closed for lack of library staff. But despite being situated probably in one of the best architectural set ups in our country remain in a dire state of deprivation.

It has started very interesting initiatives for resurrection and transformation of public libraries. There is a nodal agency squarely to work for public libraries which is called RAJA RAMMOHUN ROY LIBRARY FOUNDATION set up by Ministry of Culture. Then there is National Mission on Libraries. Their initiatives are going on in the area of digitalization of knowledge resources and setting up of virtual libraries. But the point here is that, all these efforts despite sincerity in their approach and vision are yet to yield results.

So, how should a public library look like in present scenario? We are at a stage and an era where digitization of most of the knowledge resources is happening. If we pick up our mobile, we will find all kinds of knowledge resources which are available around the globe in a digital format. That is a matter of concern as what would be the role of public library. We need to probably rethink about the new role of a public library. We need to create it as a kind of place where we can undertake new services and activities for the user communities. Public Library can



also be used for career counseling or for a lot of knowledge dissemination services about Govt. Programs. But for this we require a lot of fund, resources and kindness of Authority. The librarian and the public library are to be capacitated, to be able to receive or acquire the funds and put those funds in use in a manner in which communities are able to make use of services which are offered using those funds.

This Two day International Seminar will witness the flurry of six thematic sessions comprising "high powered invited lectures". The paper presentation tracks will provide opportunities to the presenters to showcase their 'academic & practical mettle' under technical session chairs of eminent academicians in the field of Library and Information Science.

The Seminar has become more exhilarating with the responses that it has received from India and abroad, covering the central and state universities, international organisations, which further adds to the grandeur of International Seminar on Library beyond Campus. The various research papers will throw light on the different dimensions of public libraries as viewed through lens of future possibilities. আগামী ৪ ও ৫ ফেব্রুয়ারী চার দেওয়ালের বাইরে গ্রন্থাগারের ব্যাপ্তি বিষয়ে আলোকপাত করার জন্য অত্যন্ত মনোগ্রাহী, আন্তর্জাতিক আলোচনা চক্র অনুষ্ঠিত হতে চলেছে। এই আলোচনা চক্রের বিষয় নিঃসন্দেহে সময়োপযোগী এবং প্রাসঙ্গিক। মুঠোফোন বন্দি হাজার জোড়া চোখকে বইমুখী করা বোধহয় এই মুহুর্তের সবথেকে বড় চ্যালেঞ্জ। নরসিংহ দন্ত কলেজের গ্রন্থাগার পাঠকের দর্শন, মনন, চিন্তন এবং পঠনপাঠনের শতাব্দী প্রাচীন ঐতিহ্য বয়ে নিয়ে চলেছে। কালের নিয়মে গ্রন্থাগারের পরিসর বৃদ্ধি পেয়েছে, কিন্তু বিশায়কর রকম কমেছে পাঠকের সংখ্যা। চার দেওয়ালের ঘেরাটোপে প্রজ্ঞা ও জ্ঞানের অতলান্ত ভান্ডার প্রযুক্তিদক্ষ পাঠকের উদাসীনতার আড়ালেই থেকে যায়। অথচ অক্ষরমালা ঋদ্ধ গ্রন্থের মধ্যে যে কি অপরিসীম মননশীলতা লুকিয়ে আছে তা নতুন করে আবিষ্কার করে বর্তমান প্রজম্মের কাছে পৌছে দেওয়া একটি অত্যন্ত গুরুত্বপূর্ণ সামাজিক কাজ। আর এই আলোচনা চক্র সেই বার্তাই প্রেরণ করে।

হাওড়া জেলার প্রাচীনতম শিক্ষা প্রতিষ্ঠানের পক্ষ থেকে সমস্ত সহযোগী প্রতিষ্ঠানকে আন্তরিক ধন্যবাদ জানাই। আপনাদের ঐকান্তিক প্রচেষ্টা এবং সহযোগিতায় নরসিংহ দত্ত কলেজ এমন এক বার্তাবহ মঞ্চের আয়োজন করতে পেরেছে। এই মঞ্চ গ্রন্থাগারের বিস্তৃতি, তার আধুনিকীকরণ এবং বইয়ের অন্তর্নিহিত শক্তি সম্পর্কে বয়স, পেশা এবং সামাজিক অবস্থান নির্বিশেষে সমস্ত পাঠককে সমৃদ্ধ করবে এই আশা রাখি।

আজ থেকে প্রায় একশো বছর আগে রবীন্দ্রনাথ ঠাকুর সমাজের প্রকৃত শিক্ষায় বই পড়ার তাৎপর্য নিয়ে দীর্ঘ প্রবন্ধ রচনা করেছেন, যা আজও একই রকম, বোধহয় একট বেশিই প্রাসঙ্গিক। বইযের শক্তি সম্পর্কে পাঠককে সচেতন করতে গিয়ে কবি লিখেছেন -

'বিদ্যুৎকে মানুষ লোহার তার দিয়া বাঁধিয়াছে, কিন্তু কে জানিত মানুষ শব্দকে নিঃশব্দের মধ্যে বাঁধিতে পারিবে! কে জানিত সঙ্গীতকে, হৃদয়ের আশাকে, জাগ্রত আত্মার আনন্দধ্বনিকে, আকাশের দৈববাণীকে সে কাগজে মুড়িয়া রাখিবে? কে জানিত মানুষ অতীতকে বর্তমানে বন্দী করিবে, অতলস্পর্শ কাল-সমুদ্রের উপর কেবল এক একখানি বই দিয়া সাঁকো বাঁধিয়া দিবে!' ('লাইব্রেরী' বিচিত্র প্রবন্ধ। ১৯৩৮, পৃষ্ঠা - ৩৫ - ৩৮)
